

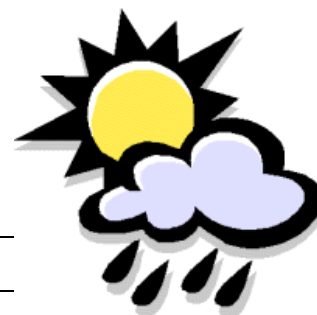
Comparing the weather in different parts of the world

Teacher's Notes

- Summary** Children look at the graph on weather patterns and identify trends.
- Aims** To understand that different areas of the world have different weather.
To use recorded data to compare rainfall.
- Activities** Children are given graphs showing the annual rainfall for Chittagong (Bangladesh) and London.
Draw a graph of the data.
Answer questions to identify trends and patterns.
- Teacher info** This task requires children to be familiar with bar graphs.

Additional work can be done around discussing the different living conditions in the UK and Bangladesh and how the weather impacts on people's lives.
Climate change could result in more places having extreme climates. Flooding may take place regularly where it did not before. Drought could become more common.

The table compares the amount of rain in Chittagong (Bangladesh) and London (UK) during 2005.



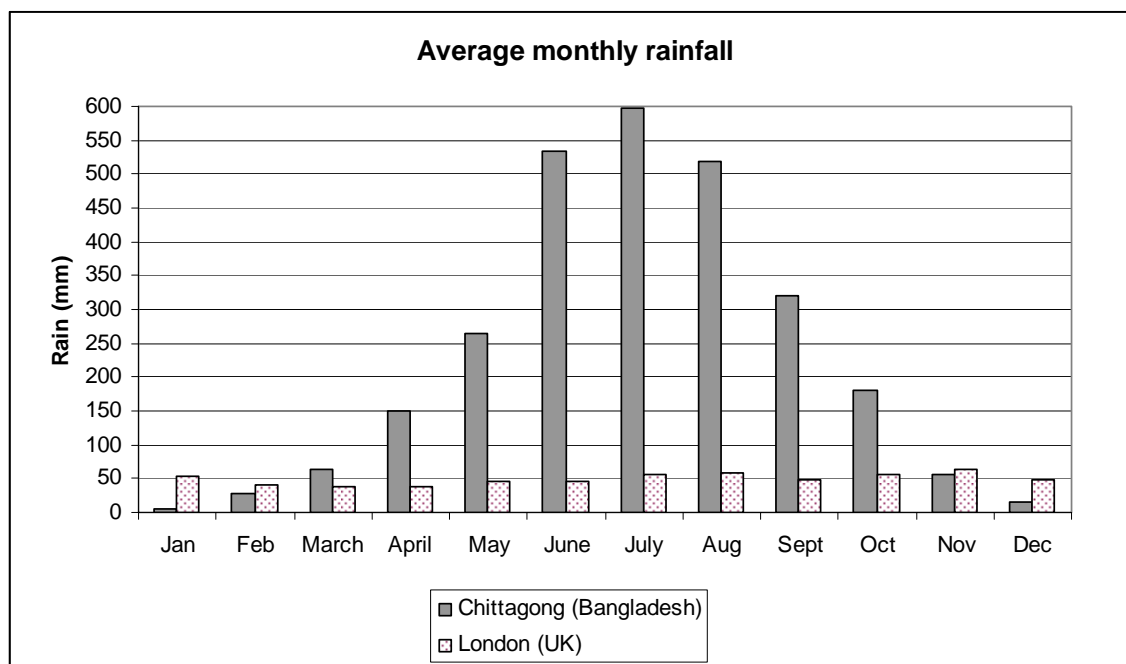
